2. Essential requirements for admission

Successful completion of a qualification equivalent to at least an Australian Senior Secondary Certificate of Education to Year 12 or international equivalent.

As academic course entry requirement is the minimum level of education required, documents indicating the applicant is currently studying or has completed a qualification higher than a secondary qualification, such as Vocational (Cert IV, Diploma, Advanced Diploma) or Higher Education (Bachelor, Masters), in either the applicant's home country or in Australia, can also be accepted as substitution for the secondary qualification. (An academic transcript indicating partial completion is sufficient).

4. Admissions Criteria

A. Applicants with recent secondary education (within the past two years)

The entry requirement for an Australian Year 12 applicant is an ATAR of 50.

B. Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study

The entry requirement for applicants with VET study is the successful completion of a Certificate IV or completion or partial completion of an Advanced Diploma or Diploma.

Applicants may also be eligible for advanced standing in recognition of prior learning.

C. Applicants with higher education study

Where an applicant has studied a postsecondary course in Australia, the most recent year of prior studies together with all other evidence is used to determine the suitability of the applicant for admission.

Applicants may also be eligible for advanced standing in recognition of prior learning.

D. Applicants with work and life experience

CIC does not have special entry criteria for entry into its courses.
